#### Safeguarding: How Safe is WhatsApp for Children - NSPCC

WhatsApp is one of the most popular instant messaging apps, used by over 2 billion people in 180 countries. It allows you to send and receive messages, as well as make voice and video calls. You can connect with people individually or join group chats where lots of people can contribute. All you need to set up a WhatsApp account is a phone number. However, children and young people can easily subvert the restrictions placed on its access. Although rated at 16+, all that is required is a phone number. All it takes is one child in a class to be on whatsapp, and all the others will wish to join. This can lead to increased vulnerabilities for child users. ## Smartphone Free Parent Pact Update: We're 1st in the West Midlands!

We've got some exciting news to share about the Parent Pact. St Nicholas is currently ranked 1st in the West Midlands for the number of parents committing to delay smartphone use until Year 9. This is a fantastic achievement and shows the strong support from our school community.

Just a quick reminder: St Nicholas School does not encourage the use of smartphones. Our policy states that pupils in Year 6, who are walking to or from school, can bring a phone if parents feel it's necessary (and they must hand it in for the day). There's no specific requirement for the type or make of the phone—it could easily be an old-fashioned model that just sends and receives texts or calls.


Our support for those parents who wish to go smartphone-free is rooted in the evidence about the vulnerabilities children can face online. This is a personal parenting choice, and it's up to each family to decide what works best for them without judgement but only with support.
