## <u> Pilgrims of Hope - Jubilee Journey through Lent</u>

This week's Lenten Symbol of the Week is the words of Jesus during His Passion and Crucifixion. Among them, He cried out:

"My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?" (Matthew 27:46)

In His suffering, Jesus felt deep pain and abandonment, just as we sometimes do in our own struggles. But even in that moment, the Father had not truly left Him—just as He never leaves us. When we face hardships and feel alone, God is actually closer than ever, holding us in His love.

During this Lenten week, let us remember: even in our darkest times, we are never forsaken. God is with us always.

One night I dreamed a dream. As I was walking along the beach with my Lord, Across the dark sky flashed scenes from my life.
