Ensuring Safe and Smooth Dismissals at the End of the School Day

Safeguarding our pupils is our number one priority at

St. Nicholas. To ensure we have the most robust procedures in place when dismissing pupils at the end of the school day, we kindly ask for your support.



You can help us by:

- Ensuring that collection arrangements are made in good time and communicated to the school—preferably via email—before 2:30 pm. Office staff regularly receive calls and emails as late as 3:28 pm! This makes it impossible to safely communicate changes to class teachers and results in office staff running around the school rather than being in the office.
- Collecting your child/grandchild and moving away from the area as quickly as possible.
 We are aware that the EYFS/KS1 path can become congested, so please keep this area clear. For any after-school chats, please head up to the footpath to avoid blocking the paths.
- Not calling to your child/grandchild to come to you before the adult in charge has
 formally dismissed them. Please pass this message on to grandparents and other family
 members who may collect your child.



We look forward to seeing you there and working together to make a positive impact for our school community.


Sutton Coldfield Charitable Trust - Uniform Grant

Key Takeaways:


- <u>Understanding Mental Health</u>: Learn how mental health evolves as children grow and navigate life's challenges.
